President Jeff Menzel called the General Meeting to order at 1:32p.m.

Jeff welcomed everyone to the Spring Fling and Bone Hunt. He commented on the great spring weather and thanked Reynolds Kennels for hosting the event . A brief explanation was given about AKC requirements for breed clubs to have a number of activities during the year. This general membership meeting satisfies one of the requirements as well as a chance to enjoy the company of members and dogs.

The Board members Matt Alston, Dianne McKee-Rowland, Joanna Smith, and Marsha King were introduced. Sylvia Lindman, the Pinkertongue editor was unable to attend.

Lita Long, the contact person for Old English Sheepdog Rescue gave a brief report about the work that she has done recently.

Priscilla Menzel, co-chair for the 2009 GPOESC Specialty dog shows Friday, July 17 at the Portland Metropolitan Exposition Center reported that these will be held in conjunction with the "Stumptown Cluster" Portland Kennel Club Dog Show held July 17-19. There will two OES shows, one in the morning and one in the afternoon. Lita Long said that specialty shows such as these were an excellent opportunity to learn more about the breed--particularly watching someone who has groomed OES for years can be an education in itself. After dogs are finished in the ring, she said it was fine to ask questions of handlers, owners, groomers--don't be afraid to ask for help if you need it. Also, there are many vendors so it's possible to buy just the right equipment and dog-related items.

Jeff talked about the Club calendar of events--the Club tries to have an event every month. The next event on Saturday, June 20 will be the Sellwood Walkabout. As with previous walkabouts in other neighborhoods (Beaverton, the Pearl), everyone meets at 11:00, socializes and then the walk takes 30 minutes to an hour to complete depending on how many people want to pet the dogs, ask questions, and interact with them. The walk usually ends at a place for coffee and snacks. In July, the Specialty dog shows will be big events. The August Walkabout will be in cool, shady Washington Park. Looking ahead to the Holidays, that Party includes a general membership meeting, Board elections, and gift exchange. Dianne has established an area on E-BAY and donated her work to sell for the Club benefit. More are welcome join in with crafting.

Lita Long passed around information about the Online OES Health Survey . It is open to anyone who owned an OES anytime in the last 10 years. OESCA (Old English Sheepdog Club of America) sponsored the comprehensive survey and will use the information collected for direct funding for specific research that can improve the health issues identified in the survey. Lita also alerted everyone to the National Specialty Oct 18-22 in Dixon, California (near Sacramento.) Held once a year, OES from all over the country come together to compete in obedience, herding,--everything! Lita said that it wasn't THAT far away when you consider the size and importance of the event.
