

## **Greater Portland Old English Sheepdog Club Minutes of the May 2010 Board Meeting**

The meeting was held May 17, 2010 at the home of Jeff and Priscilla Menzel in Beaverton, Oregon.

### **Reports**

#### **President**

Jeff has pricing on trophy aprons, colors will be selected, and discussion followed about ordering--cost, number and whether these can be sold to raise funds. Other suggestions for items to sell were tote bags and coasters. Additionally, coasters could go into judges' bags. For these, designs, colors, and pricing were discussed.

To promote program ads, examples will be featured in the next Pinkertongue. Priscilla will contact Alice Whistler to call members for donations.

Snacks for in between shows and the location for the anniversary dinner should be made soon. Jeff mentioned what was available at recent shows. Joanna asked what the budget would be and offered some suggestions. She will take care of the food. Restaurants near the Expo Center were discussed. Two McMenimins locations were settled on and Joanna will call each to see if they can accommodate the group.

Sylvia and Jeff are editing the premium list and will forward on to Carolyn.

Jeff suggested using the same the set-up and clean up schedule as last year.
